**Library Automation:**

Library has been computerized using Library Management Software SOUL 2 developed by INFLIBNET (Information Library Network) an IUC (Inter University Centre) of UGC considering the needs of academic libraries. It is a user- friendly software designed. This is a user-friendly software provide total solution for library management and administration. The entire library is functioning with the help of following module of updated version SOUL 2.

### Services

- **Lending Service**  
Students can borrow a book / periodical / CD for a period of one week for home lending and can borrow a book / periodical / CD for on premises use for that day. The previous year question paper sets are also available in the lending section for on premises issue. The e circulation (issue-return) process is computerized with help of barcode technology.
- **Book-Bank**  
The college library provides a set of text-book for entire academic year for socially as well as economically backward students. During the academic year 2014-15, 233 students availed the facility.
- **Inter Library Loan**  
The college library provides access to the reading material from the other college libraries as and when required by the students and teachers.
- **Internet Access**  
Internet facility is available in the library for teachers as well as students. 45 computers with internet connection are made available for the students. For teachers, a Network Resource Center is equipped with scanner, printer, photocopying machine and 5 computers with internet connection.
- **N-LIST**  
The library subscribes for N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) which provides access to the e-books and e-journals. As per the NLIST statistical report 8893 pages are visited and downloaded by the students and teachers during the calendar year 2014
- **Information Literacy Program**  
At the beginning of the academic year library organizes an information program for students wherein they are oriented about the library facility and services and how to search, evaluate and use the information from print as well as online sources. A library visit is also conducted for the students.
- **Project Assistance**  
The library staff assists the students for searching the information related to their project.
- **Current Awareness Service**  
The students and teachers are informed about the new arrivals in the library by displaying list and jackets on library notice board. Also, the book-reviews from various newspapers are displayed on the notice board.
- **Newspaper Clipping Service**  
The library has a collection of newspaper clippings file on various topics which are used by the especially for project work especially vernacular medium students.

- As per university norms actions are taken against the candidates who are involved in malpractices.
- Assessment of papers is completed within stipulated period. Moderation of these papers are done by experts from other colleges in the clusters, formed by university of Mumbai.
- Computerised mark sheets are distributed and consolidated mark list (ledger) is displayed.
- Candidates are given an opportunity to apply for rechecking and revaluation.
- Students are provided with the forms regarding examination related query which are forwarded to concerned exam committee members for timely redressal.

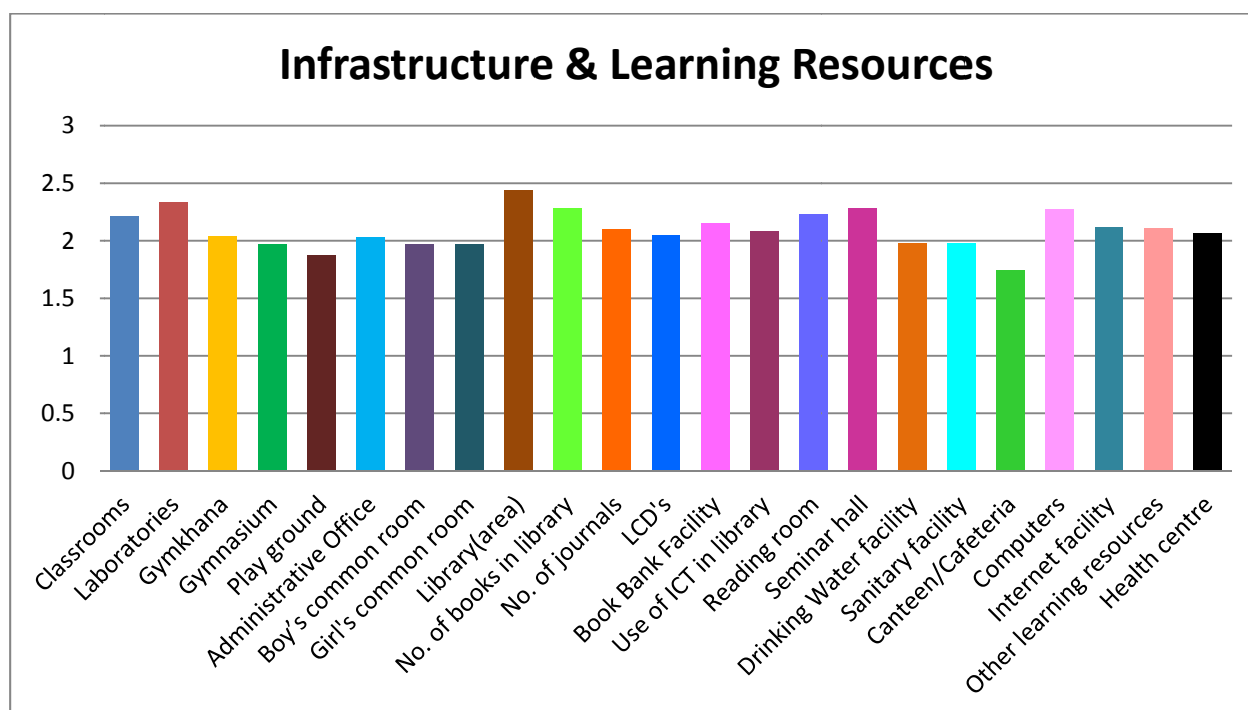

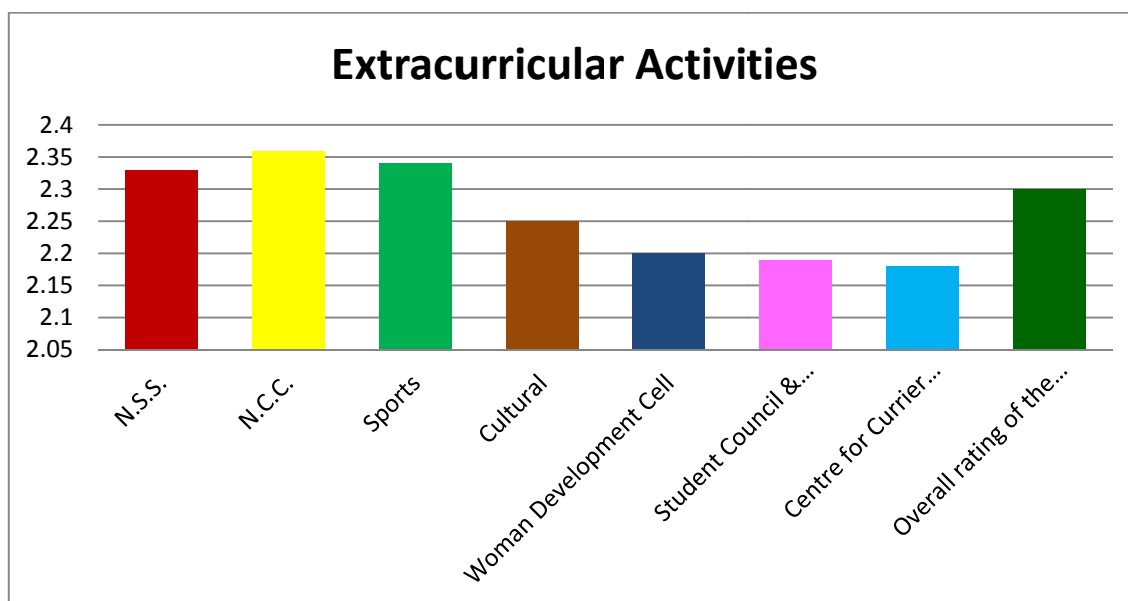
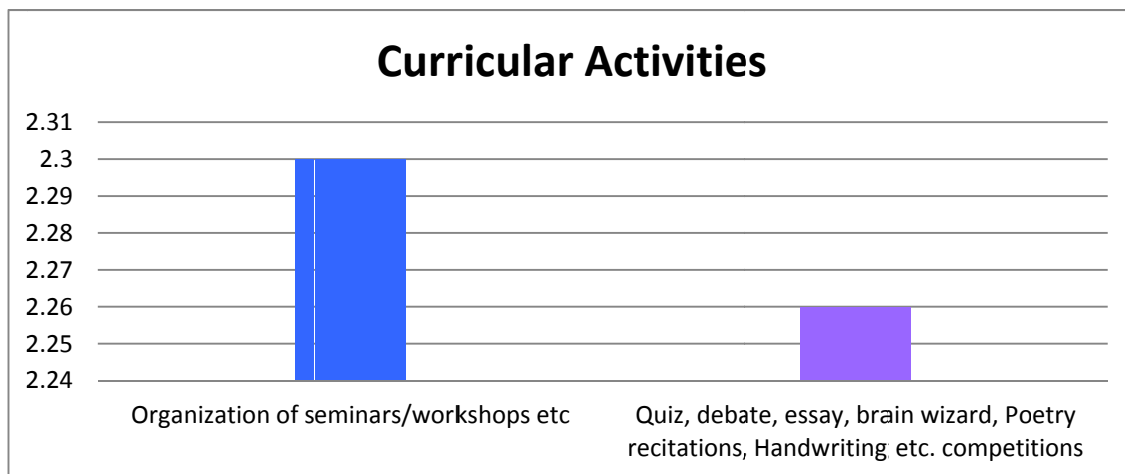
