





The college has a fully equipped Gymkhana, separate Gymnasium for boys and girls, a playground for events like Athletics, Volley-Ball, Hard Ball, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Multipurpose floor mats for indoor games. Coaches are appointed for various events who impart training for indoor and outdoor games. The college runs a yoga center for flexibility of body and stability of mind. Hikers and Trekkers club organizes hikes for the students during the different seasons of the year. The college arranges health check- up camps like CBC count especially for women. Nutritional supplements are also provided to sports persons.

Psychological Aspect:

Ensuring psychological well-being of the students becomes the important duty for the institution.

Students undergo several types of stress like performance stress, fear of failure, interpersonal relationships, coping with advanced technological changes, etc. Such issues are dealt through Counseling Cell, mentor and mentee club, Remedial Cell, anti-ragging and students grievances cell, Internal Complaints Committee.

The students with serious emotional and adjustment issues are further referred to a psychiatrist.

Social Aspect

Social development: Activities are conducted throughout the year for strengthening a sense of social responsibility among the students. NSS and NCC are the platforms through which social sensitization and awareness programmes are conducted. The activities like street plays, rally, melava, workshops are conducted for reaching out to students on
