15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

To achieve the aims and standards of NEP 2020, Satish Pradhan Dnyanasadhana College, Thane, initiated the implementation of NEP 2020. As per the guidelines from the Government of Maharashtra and the University of Mumbai, NEP 2020 was implemented for postgraduate programmes from the academic year 2023-2024. The college is affiliated with the University of Mumbai, so it has to follow the credit framework set by the University of Mumbai. As per the guidelines Major and Minor courses designed for all the programme and courses offered by the college. The college has a total 10 undergraduate programmes which include a B.A. programme in Economics, History, Sociology and Marathi, B.Sc. programme in Chemistry, Physics, Botany, and Mathematics, B.Com. programme, B.A. in Multimedia and Mass Communication, B.A. in Film, Television and New Media Production, B.Sc. in Computer Science, B.Sc. in Information Technology, B.Com. Accounting and Finance, B.Com in Baking and Insurance and Bachelor of Management Studies. Postgraduates 06 programmes offered by the college which include M.Sc. Organic Chemistry, M.Sc. Botany, M.Sc. Information Technology, M.Com. Advanced Accountancy, M.Com Business Management and M.Com. Banking and Finance. Along with UG and PG, 02 doctoral programmes Ph.D. (Science) in Chemistry and Ph.D. (Commerce) in Business Policy and Administration offered by the college. A total of 15 Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) have been signed in 2023-2024 for internships, research activities, faculty exchanges, and student exchanges, serving as formal agreements between institutions to collaborate on various academic and professional initiatives. This MoU facilitates internships, providing students with practical experience and exposure to real-world work environments. It also promotes research activities, encouraging joint projects and the sharing of resources and expertise to advance knowledge in specific fields. Faculty exchange programs under the MoU enable educators to teach and conduct research at partner institutions, fostering professional development and cross-cultural understanding.

Similarly, student exchange programs allow students to study abroad, enriching their educational experience and broadening their global perspectives. Overall, such MoUs enhance the academic and professional growth of all participants, contributing to the development of a more interconnected and collaborative educational landscape.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Satish Pradhan Dnyanasadhana College has proactively adopted the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) system to align with national educational standards. The college has successfully applied for its ABC ID, with the National Academic Depository (NAD) ID being NAD064119. To improve understanding and utilization of the system, the college organized informative sessions for students, highlighting the significance, benefits, and practical applications of the ABC ID. All registered students now have unique ABC IDs. During the admission process, students were required to include their ABC IDs on their admission forms. This step ensures that academic credits are recorded and managed accurately within the ABC system, which improves the management of academic records and enhances future educational opportunities.

17.Skill development:

The college is committed to enhancing student skill development through various initiatives and collaborations. Highlights include: National Education Policy (NEP) Conclave: The college organized a conclave focused on innovative educational strategies and policies, aimed at degree college teachers. This event facilitated discussions on enhancing educational practices and aligning with NEP 2020. Certificate and Add-On Courses: this year, the college has offered 13 certificate and add-on courses designed to boost student skills and employability. Incredible Learning Innovations for Knowledge Empowerment (iLike Lab): In partnership with Maharashtra Knowledge Corporation Limited (MKCL), the college has established the iLike Lab. This collaboration will introduce various certificate courses, further supporting skill development. Acharya Chanakya Kaushalya Vikas Kendra: The College established Acharya Chanakya Kaushalya Vikas Kendra in collaboration with the District Skill Development, Employment and Entrepreneurship Guidance Centre, Thane under Pramod Mahajan Kaushalya and Udyojakata Vikas Abhiyan. Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs): The college has established Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with a range of organizations to further broaden the scope of skill development. These partnerships will ensure that students receive industry-relevant education, and prepare them for successful careers in their chosen fields.

The institution adopts experiential learning to connect theoretical concepts with real-world scenarios, enabling students to pursue a

wide range of academic and professional pathways. 3.2 - Innovation Ecosystem

3.2.1 - Institution has created an ecosystem for innovations and has initiatives for creation and transfer

of knowledge

The institution is dedicated to fostering an innovative and entrepreneurial ecosystem. Its Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell, led by a registered patent agent, conducted one workshop benefiting 29 participants. The Indian Knowledge System (IKS) is spearheaded by UGC-trained conveners, with one textbook on the IKS syllabus published.

Entrepreneurship is promoted through the Student Activity Centre, which organized six workshops benefiting 257 students. The "Urja Setu" initiative attracted 1,277 participants, including students, teachers, and micro-entrepreneurs, to explore alternatives to plastics. The Research Promotion Cell (RPC) has developed a Research Promotion Policy (RPP), leading to the publication of 22 research papers and five books/chapters. Seven workshops on research methodology have benefited 1,254 participants, and 37 students have presented papers at various seminars.

To ensure academic integrity, the institution uses Eaarjav plagiarism detection software, supporting 18 research papers and one thesis. The N-List program enables access to e-resources, while ISO 21001:2018 certification since 2021-2022 underscores its quality standards. Thirteen certificate courses have benefited 1,454 students, and the Dnyanakosh journal promotes peer-reviewed research.

The Aavishkar Research Convention encouraged 57 student participants and showcased 15 research projects, highlighting the institution's commitment to innovation, research, and knowledge dissemination.

Programs like Punitsagar Swachhata Abhiyaan and Deep Clean Drive further reinforce sustainable practices.

Social Campaigns emphasize inclusion and awareness through activities such as Raksha Bandhan with Signal School students and traffic police, a free library at Sathewadi, Diwali celebrations with tribal communities, AIDS awareness drives, road safety campaigns, and a cycle rally for transgender rights.

In adopted villages, the institution promoted superstition eradication, organized health checkups, distributed medicines, and provided educational resources like libraries, projectors, and learning materials.

Students actively participated in leadership programs, the State Republic Day parade, AVHAN camp, and Indian Army recruitment as Agniveer. 4.1 - Physical Facilities

- 4.1.1 The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.
 - The college spans a 2.25-acre campus with modern infrastructure that supports the holistic development of students.
 - It offers 51 spacious, well-lit, and ICT-enabled classrooms equipped with projectors and also under CCTV Surveillance to ensure the safety of the students
 - Facilities include a seminar hall with a 112-seat capacity and a smart podium, two conference rooms, and an open auditorium with ICT amenities that seats 250 people.
 - The campus also has 17 well-equipped science laboratories with advanced instruments such as spectrophotometers, research microscopes, and deep freezers, along with IT labs featuring 211 high-performance computers.
 - The administrative block is fully ICT-enabled, while the library offers access through Web-OPAC and a mobile application.
 - A botanical garden enriches environmental education.
 - Sustainability is a priority, with solar-powered streetlights and generator backups for uninterrupted power.
 - Safety is ensured with campus-wide firefighting systems and strategically placed fire extinguishers.
 - Accessibility features include two elevators, ramps for differently-abled individuals, and a first-aid room with a wheelchair and stretcher for medical emergencies.
 - Potable drinking water is available on all floors, and the campus is connected through a public address system.
 - This well-rounded infrastructure fosters academic excellence, environmental responsibility, and inclusivity, empowering students to thrive in a supportive and sustainable

environment.

- A 5075 Sq. ft. rectangular college campus sports ground is used for Outdoor Games like Volleyball, Handball, Kabaddi, and Kho-Kho. The college hires Dharmaveer Anand Dighe Maidan from the municipal corporation as and when needed for outdoor games.
- A 4100 Sq. ft. gymkhana with a separate gymnasium for boys and girls has equipment like a Treadmill, Stepper, Cycle, Four-Station Gym, Cross-over Gym, Calf Machine, Abdominal Curl, Vibrator Belt, Bench Press, Vertical Leg Press, Arm Curling Machine, Peck Deck Butterfly Machine, and Dumbbells (2Kg-10Kg).
- Gymkhana has facilities for Indoor Games like Carom, Table Tennis and Chess
- The College has one Audiovisual Room with a smart podium and one Open auditorium with a seating capacity of 250 and Audiovisual facilities for organizing cultural events. It is an active space for various exhibitions, demonstrations, festivals, and cultural activities like music, and theatre, particularly street plays, talks, rangoli, and photography competitions.
- The recording studio is equipped with all the professional equipment and facilities
- Yoga activity is conducted on the terrace and in P. Savlaram Auditorium.
- A separate office space is allocated for NSS, NCC, Women Development Cell, and Placement Cell.

- The college library is a state-of-the-art facility automated since 2007 with SOUL 3.0 Library Management Software developed by INFLIBNET. Fully computerized, it offers user-friendly management, including barcoded circulation and online resource access via OPAC, also available through a mobile app.
- The library houses over 80,000 books, 105 periodicals, 347 audio-visual materials, and access to e-resources through the UGC N-LIST program, which provides over 6,000 journals and two lakh books to staff and students since 2011.
- Equipped with 15 desktop computers, one laptop, seven printers, a photocopy machine, a scanner, cordless barcode readers, and an LCD projector, the Knowledge Resource Centre also features internet-connected systems for accessing eresources.
- Specialized sections cater to differently-abled students and competitive exam preparations.
- Rare collections include the Constitution of India, Marathi Vishwakosh etc..
- Library maintenance includes regular pest control and cleaning.
- The library promotes learning through theme-based book exhibitions on occasions like International Yoga Day, Science Day and so on.
- It also offers a book bank facility benefitting 600 students annually and seating for 280 readers, including a dedicated teacher section.
- With CCTV surveillance, QR code-enabled services, and a dedicated website, the library ensures seamless access to knowledge resources.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 - Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

To meet the dynamic demands of the digital era, the college has transformed its IT infrastructure, enhancing educational methodologies, research, and administrative operations. All classrooms are ICT-enabled and under CCTV surveillance, with 284 cameras monitoring the campus for safety and teaching quality. The

college houses four advanced computer labs with upgraded hardware and software to meet curriculum needs, supporting 307 desktops, 31 laptops, and 51 LCD projectors. Additional facilities include 41 printers, 17 Wi-Fi routers, and a digital display board.

The campus is connected via optical fiber and dual-band Wi-Fi, supported by two high-configuration servers (Linux and Windows) for fast data transmission. A 100 Mbps LAN ensures seamless connectivity, and robust data protection is in place with firewalls and antivirus software. Faculty and students have access to advanced tools, including Microsoft 365, Tally ERP, RedHat, and SOUL 3.0.

The college recently transitioned to MasterSoft ERP for administration, admissions, and examinations, facilitating digitalized operations. Attendance for staff is recorded using a biometric system with face recognition. The Knowledge Resource Centre, equipped with 45 internet-enabled computers, provides access to databases. IT infrastructure is maintained through external agencies and on-campus IT consultants, ensuring uninterrupted support for academic and administrative excellence.

The college adheres to ISO 21001:2018-certified systems and has established comprehensive policies and procedures to maintain its infrastructure facilities, supervised by a full-time appointed official.

Classrooms: The timetable is designed for optimal utilization, and cleanliness and maintenance of furniture and equipment are ensured through Annual Maintenance Contracts (AMCs). The entire campus is equipped with a fire-fighting system for safety.

Library: The library offers home and in-campus lending services and access to resources through OPAC and a mobile application. The Knowledge Resource Centre provides online resources, and library footfall is recorded using a register. Facilities for differently-abled students are available, and the library operates from 7:30 AM to 5:30 PM.

Sports Complex: Attendance is monitored through a sign-in/out register. Required sports equipment and lockers are provided, with regular servicing of gymnasium equipment to ensure functionality.

Laboratories: Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) are followed, and resources are shared across departments. Inventory records are maintained, and the "just-in-time" approach is used for chemical purchases. Annual stock checks and AMCs ensure the proper maintenance of laboratory instruments.

These systems reflect the college's commitment to maintaining highquality infrastructure to support academic, sports, and extracurricular activities.

Academic Performance Indicator (API) using Teacher log book/diary. The form, the Log book and the copies of other documents in support the claims, are submitted to the HOD for verification and validation. The form approved by HOD is then forwarded to IQAC.

IQAC Verifies and validates API points and recommends the case to the University through the Principal after ensuring that the staff member fulfils all prescribed conditions and has become eligible for PBAS / CAS.

The affiliating University appoints Panel/Committee for CAS, which again verifies and validates the API scores claimed, based on documents and personal interview.

The Panel/Committee, then recommends the case to the Joint Director, Higher Education Government of Maharashtra, for Pay and Grade fixation.

After the declaration of results of Examinations, the performance of Teachers is evaluated on the basis of subject-wise and teacher-wise result analysis.

Solid Waste Management:

The college has a proper solid waste management system. A 'tumbler composter' unit has been installed for treatment of wet waste and garden litter. It consists of two drums of 110 litre capacity each. The capacity of each drum is 80 kg, at intake capacity of 8-10 kg per day. With the combined action of the starter culture, aeration, moisture and mixing of components, the compost is generated within a curing period of 20-25 days. The output is 20% of the total input.

Liquid Waste Management:

Liquid waste is properly disposed through underground drainage system. Chemicals in chemistry laboratory are diluted and disposed or recovered and reused.

Adequate number of exhaust fans are provided in laboratories to drive out hazardous gases. To exhaust gases generated during the practical in Chemistry laboratory, fuming hoods are installed.

E-waste Management:

All stakeholders were appealed to join this noble cause aimed at saving the environment by disposing of their e-waste responsibly. Collected E-waste was submitted to TMC for proper recycling.

"Being Me" initiative, a five-year program, focuses on sensitizing college stakeholders towards the LGBTQ community, Divyangjan, gender-based health issues, the upliftment of unskilled labor, and senior citizens.

The year began with a sensitization session for first-year students, introducing the objectives of "Being Me". A session for teaching staff, titled "Breaking Barriers: Exploring Sex, Gender, and Trans Rights", was attended by 113 faculty members and addressed the differences between sex, gender, and sexual orientation. A preconference session led by Jeevan Samvardhan highlighted the challenges faced by homeless children and explored policy-based solutions.

The "New Year Celebration: Exploring Family Heritage with Grandparents" encouraged students to create family trees, fostering

a sense of identity and bonding. The Commerce faculty organized "Navigating the World Beyond Constraints," where motivational talks by Divyangjan achievers inspired 241 students.

The Science Faculty, in collaboration with Rotary Club of Thane Garden City, hosted a session on "Mental Well-Being and Emotional Intelligence," benefiting 92 students and 20 staff members.

An online event, "Ek Selfie Toh Banta Hai," celebrated intergenerational bonds through a selfie competition with grandparents. The year concluded with conference, "From Struggle to Strength: Navigating and Networking Homeless Children," which addressed homelessness, featuring 239 participants and 65 research presentations.
