#### **DNYANASADHANA COLLEGE, THANE**

A full fledged Degree College was started in June 1983. The college is affili ated to the University of Mumbai. The college has faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce on aided basis and B.Sc. Computer Science and Bachelor of Mass Media (BMM) / Bachelor of Management Studies (BMS) on unaided basis. The college has fully qualified and competent teaching staff and ad equate non-teaching staff. We are expanding our premises for providing be tter amenities and facilities. We have a new building of our own with future expansion plan duly approved by competent authorities of which the work is in progress. It is located behind ACC Research Centre, Thane. (West). Th e College complex is located on a 2.25 acres plot. It offers all modern amen ities needed for all round development of the student's personality. Prospe ctive students, parents and visitors can commute from Thane Railway Stati on by auto rickshaw or city bus services. The College offers all modern fac ilities such as Library Reading rooms, Internet Club, auditorium, well equip ped Computer laboratory with digital overhead projectors, gymkhana, gym, A.V. Room, students common room, to mention a few. The aim of the colle ge is to encourage and promote education to socially, economically backw ard and weaker section of the society. The college also aims to assist stud ents in advancement of their education by giving scholarships, prizes, loan s, and books for studies. The college also plans to achieve academic stand ards of high quality.

#### LIBRARY

The College library has a collection of more than 20,000 books dedicated t o the streams of Arts, Science and Commerce, more than 75 periodicals ar e subscribed by the college library. There are separate sections for Compu ter Science, B.M.M., and B.M.S.

From the year 2002 - 2003 Dnyanasadhana College Library has started Sch olar Cards facility for the first 25 merit holders from each class. This Schol ar Card entitles students to get two additional reference books for home is sue from the Library.

## **INTERNET CLUB**

The Dnyanasadhana management has introduced the Internet Club in the C ollege premises. The students have overwhelmingly subscribed for the me mbership. The new entrants to the college are advised to subscribe membe rship of Internet Club. This facility is made available at a very low members hip subscription of Rs. 300 per academic year exclusively for Dnyanasadha na College Students. As such in the larger interest of individual developme nt and to keep pace with advanced technology students are earnestly advi sed to become members of the club.

#### **<u>GYMNASIUM</u>**

Well equipped with full kit of power lifting, weight lifting, four station multig ym, treadmill, cycle, twister etc. It is open to students from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. The college promotes its students to become instructors so as to encoura ge earning and learning by giving some financial assistance

#### YOGA TRAINING

Throughout the year yogasana courses are run and the students who are g ood yoga trained are given chance to become instructors with some financ ial assistance. Also visiting yoga teachers impart training to the students. Yogasana courses start from the first Monday of every month, two batches one is from 6 a.m. to 7 a.m. and other from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. The training is f or 20 days.

#### **LABORATORIES**

The college has well equipped, spacious laboratories for Physics, Chemist ry, Physical Chemistry, Biology and Computers and the language English.

#### **INSURANCE**

Considering the current hazards of travel, the college provides to insure th e students in and out of college premises. The premium per insured studen t is Rs.40/- per academic year. The Insurance cover is for one calendar year from 1st September 2004 to 31st August 2005, it covers for accident and d eath, and the maximum limit is Rupees One Lakh.

#### PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

Besides these activities, for students welfare and benefits, discourses are arranged through professionals a nd experts for personality development in sports / gymkhana. The colle ge provides facilities for indoor and outdoor games. The college encour ages the students to participate in inter collegiate events at district and above levels, by providing specialized coaching facilities. The students who prove their merits will be considered for scholarships

## <u>N.S.S.</u>

The National Service Scheme unit of Dnyanasadhana College provides opp ortunities to students to participate in various urban and rural projects. 
