## About the College

*Satish Pradhan Dnyanasadhana College, Thane (Formerly known as Dnyanasadhana College, Thane) a Premier Education Institute, is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1960, on 2nd July 1980. The Junior College was recognized by the Education Department, Government of Maharashtra by an order dated 22nd October 1980. By virtue of natural growth a full fledged Degree College was started on 13th June 1983. The college is permanently affiliated to the University of Mumbai and is recognized by UGC 2(f) and 12B. It is Re-Accreditated 'B+' Grade (CGPA 2.69 3rd Cycle completed) by NAAC & also ISO (21001:2018) certified.*

*The College has faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce on aided basis and 1) B. A. Multimedia and Mass Communication, 2) B. Sc. Computer Science, 3) B. Sc. Information Technology, 4) B. Com. (Accounting and Finance), 5) B. Com. (Banking and Insurance) and 6) Bachelor of Management Studies (AICTE Approved), on unaided basis. The college has fully qualified and competent teaching staff and adequate non-teaching staff. The building is located off Eastern Express Highway, Dnyanasadhana Marg, Thane (West). The College complex is spread over a plot of 2.2 acres with built-up space of about 93000 sq.ft. It offers all modern amenities needed for all-round development of the students' personality. It is accessible from Thane railway station by auto rickshaw and city bus. The institution also offers modern facilities such as library, reading room, internet club, auditorium, well equipped computer labs with digital overhead projectors, gymkhana, state of the art gymnasium, Audio-Visual room, to mention a few.*

*Students can pursue their post graduation in 1) M. Com. Business Management, 2) M. Com. Advanced Accountancy and 3) M. Com. Banking and Finance and 1) M.Sc. Chemistry (By Paper), 2) M.Sc. Chemistry (By Research), 3) M.Sc. Botany - By Paper and 4) M.Sc. Information Technology.*

*The college also has a research centre for Ph.D. in Chemistry and Ph.D. Commerce. The college is also a centre for Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University.*

*The aim of the college is to encourage and promote education to all sections of society, especially the socially and economically backward and weaker sections of society.*

### **Library**

*The college library has a vast collection of more than 82279 books covering various fields of interest in social sciences, humanities and pure sciences. Out of which approximately 19350 books are in Marathi. It has separate collection of Audio, Video materials like CDs, DVDs etc. It has subscriptions of over 105 periodicals which include academic journals out of which two are in brail script and popular magazines of general interest and 22 newspapers. In addition to this, the library provides access to thousands of e-resources through N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) and other databases. The library is fully computerized and students can access the collection through Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC). The reading room of the library provides facility to 300 students at a time. A separate section equipped with required resources has been developed for the students preparing for competitive examinations.*

## **Book Bank**

The library provides textbooks to economically backward and Reserve Category students under the Book Bank Scheme. Every year, approximately 300 students avail of this facility. Students may contact the librarian for membership of the Book Bank Scheme. The Last date for enrolment is 31<sup>st</sup> July.

## **Scholar Card for Advanced Learners**

The first 20 merit holders from each faculty are honoured with a scholar card which entitles them to two additional reference books for home issue from the Library.

## **Internet Club (Knowledge Resource Centre)**

The college has a Knowledge Resource Centre that every student can avail of. The College has subscribed to N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) by which students can access 7500 e-books and 2700 e-Journals.

## **Laboratories**

The college has well equipped and spacious laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Information Technology and Computer Science for undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.

## **Insurance**

Every Student is insured for a maximum limit of 4 lakhs by paying a nominal premium of 100/- per academic year. It covers accident and death.

## **Self Enhancement**

In addition to academic pursuit of the students, there are associations, clubs and groups, which conduct programmes, seminars and workshops for overall development of students, including leadership qualities and social awareness. Such activities are organised through the following:

A teacher convener or programme officer, who is assisted by other teaching staff, heads the Association, Club, Group or Organisation. The convener or the programme officer, involve the students to develop various skills. The Art Circle conducts various competitions to

encourage students to participate in the annual social gathering, 'Utopia' (Degree College), intercollegiate events, state and national level competitions organised by the University of Mumbai. The college gymkhana provides facilities for indoor and outdoor games. The college encourages the students to participate in intercollegiate events at district and above levels, by providing specialised coaching facilities. The students who prove their merit are considered for scholarships.

### **National Service Scheme (N.S.S.)**

The National Service Scheme unit is recognised by University of Mumbai and conducts its program under the joint guidance of University of Mumbai and University Grants Commission. The purpose of the NSS unit is to sensitize the student to the socio-economic conditions of the weaker sections of the society. The purpose is also to provide the students with opportunities to participate in urban and rural activities and the upliftment of the deprived class. The activities include Swachhata Abhiyan, Street plays, rallies, tree plantation, yoga day and observing various important days of national and international significance. This includes a compulsory attendance at seven day residential camp in the chosen rural area. The NSS office is located on the 4th floor. Enrollment is strictly by selection. 10 Marks are awarded by the university at the end of the year subject to the completion of duties by the student as an NSS volunteer.

### **National Cadet Corps (N.C.C.); (Girls and Boys)**

The College has inaugurated the N.C.C. Unit in 2007 and the Boys Unit in 2009. The Total strength to be enrolled in a year in Girls' unit is 50 cadets and the Boys' unit is 60 cadets from XI, XII and First Year of Graduation. The interested students can enrol their names in the month of July and August in the N.C.C. office, fourth floor, Gymkhana, between 10:00 am and 12:00 noon.

The associate NCC Officers of both the units are Cpt. Dr. Radhika Mukherjee (Girls Unit) and LT. Dilip Vasave (Boys Unit).

Throughout the year the cadets are trained in drill, social services, lectures related to N.C.C. syllabus, firing and map reading. They attend Combine Annual Training Camps, Thal Sainik Camps, Republic Day Camp-group selection and National camps such as mountaineering, Trekking, Rock climbing, Scuba diving, Para-basic/sailing, Medical, Army Attachment, National Integration camp, Personality Development camp, TSC, RDC, etc.

### **Students' Welfare Fund**

*The fund is utilised to provide assistance to the needy and deserving students and to provide necessary equipments and other facilities for all round development of the students.*

### **Internal Complaint Committee**

As per UGC regulations (Prevention, Prohibition & Redressal of Sexual Harrassment of women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) of 2015, college has constituted Internal Complaint Committee (ICC) for dealing with the issues of Gender Based Violence on campus. ### **Gymkhana**

## **Important Information to the Students Seeking Admission**

*(All Students/Parents/Guardians should read carefully and understand)*

1. *Students seeking admission from other colleges should have passed in all subjects and obtained No Objection Certificate (N.O.C.) from the last college attended.*
2. *Students should note that all admissions will be as per prevailing University rules/ Board rules and Government norms and will be provisional till confirmed by the authorities.*
3. *Students seeking admission at F.Y. in any stream should verify the subjects available at T. Y. level. College shall offer only those subjects or combinations which are mentioned in the prospectus.*
4. *All parents/guardians must sign the admission form after going through and understanding the rules, regulations and code of conduct governing their wards.*
5. *Students who do not submit original mark sheet, passing certificate and leaving certificate and other necessary documents will not be granted admission and if granted, all such admissions will be provisional.*
6. *If any educational information and documents submitted by students are found to be false or misleading, it will call for legal action and expulsion from the college.*

*(Note: In case of any disputes, the decision of the Principal will be final and binding.)*

## **Rules to be Followed by Students**

1. *Every student must possess a valid Identity Card issued to him/her by the college authorities, with photograph bearing the signature of the Principal. The card must be kept on display (either with a sling or clip or worn around the neck). Any student without a valid College Identity Card will not be permitted to enter the college premises.*
2. *Students' attendance in lectures, practicals, field visits is compulsory as per University guidelines. Accordingly, every student must attend at least 75% of the total number of lectures. Attendance for tutorials/practicals, all the class tests, assignments engaged in each term of the respective academic year is compulsory.*
3. *Students remaining absent during lectures, practicals or examination on medical grounds must submit medical certificate to the vice principal/course co-ordinator or parent teacher or Examination committee convener immediately after the examination.*
4. *Students are required to be present in classroom well in time.*
5. *All students should maintain strict silence in the corridors, classrooms and library hall.*
6. *Every student is responsible for taking care of the college property and maintaining cleanliness of the premises.*

7. While representing the college in workshops, seminars, excursion, field visits, internships etc. all students should follow utmost discipline and decorum.
8. Every student should read the notices displayed by the college from time to time. Any ignorance or failure on their part to read the notices will not be excused.
9. Library books, periodicals etc. should be handled carefully. Any damage or loss of books by the students should be compensated for within 7 days.
10. All students are informed that they must carefully fill examination forms on or before the due date notified. All T.Y. students should note that their form submission as per university guidelines is online.
11. All students and their parents should note that discipline is of utmost priority in gaining admission to the college and that discipline must be maintained by students throughout their tenure in this college.
12. Any student failing to attend the college for 75% of the total number of lectures/tutorials/practicals engaged during the academic year is liable for disciplinary action resulting in cancellation of his/her admission.

## **Bachelor of Mass Media (B.M.M) Revised Nomenclature : B.A. in Multimedia and Mass Communication (B.A.M.M.C.)**

BAMMC implemented from 2019-20 initially read as BMM is a three year undergraduate course introduced by University of Mumbai in the academic year 1999-2000. The revised nomenclature from BMM to BAMMC, revised subjects and syllabus is very much industry oriented. The program considers media industries and their relationship to culture and society, and the understanding of how communication works. BAMMC Program emphasizes the development of critical thinking, professional writing skills and effective oral communication.

### **F.Y.B.A.M.M.C. (Semester I and II)**

#### **Eligibility:**

A candidate for being eligible for admission to the degree course in **B.A. in Multimedia and Mass Communication (B.A.M.M.C.)** shall have passed XII Std. Examination of Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent from the Science, Arts or Commerce Stream.

No college shall conduct any entrance test in any form and the admissions are purely based on merit duly following the reservation policy as per the norms of Government of Maharashtra. While drawing the merit list, weightage has to be given to students from Arts, Commerce and Science Stream at XII Standard level. The stream wise weightage to be given is as under:

- a. The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.
- b. In case if no application is received from any stream, the vacant seats are to be distributed equally between the two streams only.
- c. After the first merit list is displayed, if any seat allotted to one stream remains vacant, the same shall be distributed equally between the remaining two streams. In case of vacancy in one stream is of single/odd number of seats, the single seat is to be allotted to the Arts Stream. In case if no application is available from the two streams, then all the vacant seats of such two streams must be transferred to the third stream.

Step (c) be repeated for the subsequent merit lists till all the forms are exhausted or the final merit list is displayed, whichever is earlier.



Examination of the Maharashtra Board of Higher Secondary Education or its equivalent examination or Diploma in any Engineering branches with two years or three years duration after S.S.C. conducted by the Board of Technical Education, Maharashtra State or its equivalent examination by securing minimum 45% marks for general category (in one attempt) at the respective Examination and minimum 40% marks for the reserved category (in one attempt). *The applications are to be accepted and processed by the colleges stream wise separately and the merit list is to be displayed stream wise taking into account the reservation policy prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra.*

- a. The merit list is to be prepared and displayed stream wise.*
- b. In case if no applications are received under the “Diploma in Engineering and other Category” or if the seats remain vacant in “Diploma in Engineering and other Category” after all the merit lists/forms are exhausted, the vacant seats must be transferred to Commerce Stream.*
- c. In case if no application is received from any stream the vacant seats are to be distributed equally between the remaining two streams only.*
- d. After the first merit list is displayed, if any seat allotted to one stream remains vacant, the same shall be distributed equally between the remaining two streams. In case of vacancy in one stream is of single/odd number of seats, the single seat is to be allotted to the Commerce Stream. In case if no applications are available from the two streams, then all the vacant seats of such two streams must be transferred to the third stream.*
- e. Step (d) be repeated for the subsequent merit lists till all the forms are exhausted or the final merit list is displayed, whichever is earlier*

#### **Application and Interview**

- Candidates who desire to register for the Ph.D. degree and have passed the entrance test (PET) conducted by the University of Mumbai and who are exempted from the test under clause No.9 of this VCD, shall apply in the prescribed form and submit it along with a demand draft/cash of Rs. 100 to the concerned recognized Research Centre of University of Mumbai within fifteen working (15) days from the date of the declaration of the Ph.D. Entrance Test (PET) results.
- After scrutiny of applications received, the Head of the Research Centre shall invite the eligible candidates for subject-wise interviews by giving 10 days notice after the last date of application. A list of eligible candidates who are also invited for interviews shall be displayed on the notice board.
- The Head of the research centre shall constitute subject-wise interview committees to interview the candidates who have passed the Ph.D. Entrance Test (PET). The committee shall be constituted as per the guidelines given below. The quorum for the meeting of the committee shall constitute one subject expert, the Research Guide and the Head of the Department. In case of vacancies for reserved candidate, one approved teacher (not below the rank of Reader) from the reserved category of the concerned faculty is mandatory.

## Mode of Refund of Fees and Deposits

**Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admissions:** The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate courses in Government college, in Government aided and recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation and thereafter the percentage of fees of the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

**Table-1: Fee Deduction on Cancellation of Admission**

Sr. No.	Period	Percentages of Deduction
1.	Prior to commencement of academic and instruction of the course	500/- Lumpsum
2.	Upto 20 days after the commencement of academic term of the course	20% of total amount of fees
3.	From 21 days to 50 days after commencement of academic term of the course	30% of the total amount of fees
4.	From 51 days to 80 days after the commencement of academic term of the course or 31st August whichever is earlier	50% of the total amount of fees
5.	From 1 <sup>st</sup> September to 30 <sup>th</sup> September	60% of the total amount of fees
6.	After 30 <sup>th</sup> September	100% of the total amount of fees

**NOTE:**

The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term, of the course includes the following:

1. All the fees items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
2. The fees charged towards group insurance and all fees components to be paid as University share (including Vice-Chancellor Fund, University fees for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, Disaster Management fund, Examination fees and Enrollment fees) are non-refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.

3. Fees collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and prospectus, enrollment and any other course specific fees are not refundable after the commencement of the academic term.
4. All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) shall be fully returned at the time of cancellation provided that wherever admissions are made through centralized admission process for professional and/or for any other courses by other component Authorities. The refund rules are applicable if specified by such authorities (as per the rule of relevant agencies) for the 1<sup>st</sup> year admission. In case of admission to subsequent years of the course, 0.2859 is applicable for cancelled admission. Provided further that this refund rule is concurrent with the rules and guidelines of other professional statutory bodies appointed for admission for relevant courses. Further that 0.2859-A and 0.2859-B have been repealed and the amended 0.2859 relating to the refund of tuition fees, development and all other fees after cancellation of admission for the Under Graduate Courses has been brought into force with effect from the academic year 2008-2009.

## Refund Regulations

1. If a student informs the Principal of the College/ Institution, in writing, within 30 days from the date of commencement of the term that he/she desires to cancel his/her admission, all fees shall be refunded to him/her after deduction of Rs.30/- (Rupees thirty only) as administrative charges.
  - i. At the time of applying for admission, he/she intimates in writing, that he/she has also applied or intends to apply for admission to one or more of the professional colleges or Institutions or Departments affiliated to this University which impart instruction for Degree Courses in Engineering, Architecture, Physiotherapy, Technology, Medicine, Dentistry, Ayurveda, Unani medicine, Homeopathy, Painting, Commercial Art, Home science and Courses conducted by the National Defence Academy or Indian Institute of Technology or Regional Colleges of Engineering.
  - ii. He/She withdraws his/her application, within 7 days from the date of his/her admission to a professional college or a course mentioned above but not later than 31<sup>st</sup> August of the same academic year. In such cases, it shall be binding on the student to produce documentary proof of his/her being admitted to the professional course.
2. All fees paid by the student at the time of admission shall be refunded to him/her on production of receipts after deducting Rs.250/- (Rupees two hundred fifty only) or all prescribed fees, whichever is less as administrative charges, on following conditions.

- i. At the time of applying for admission, he/she intimates in writing, that he/she has also applied or intends to apply for admission to one or more of the professional colleges or institutions or departments affiliated to this University which impart instruction for degree course in Engineering, Architecture, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Audiology and Speech Therapy, Unani Medicine, Homeopathy, Painting, Commercial Art, Home Science and Courses conducted by the National Defence Academy or Indian Institute of Technology or Regional Colleges of Engineering.
- ii. He/She withdraws his application in writing within 7 days from the date of his/her admission to a professional college or a 1 course mentioned in (1) above, but not later than 30<sup>th</sup> September of the same academic year. In such cases, it shall be binding on the student to produce documentary proof of his/her being admitted to the professional course.
- iii. For any cancellation after 30<sup>th</sup> September but before the end of the term, a student will be eligible to receive the share of tuition fee for the second term and the annual examination fee if already paid. The students will not be eligible for any refund if cancellation/studies discontinued after the end of first term.

#### **Examinations Forms**

1. Forms for examinations in October have to be filled on or before 10<sup>th</sup> August.
2. Late - Fee forms have to be filled on or before 30<sup>th</sup> August with a fine of 100
3. Forms for Examination in March have to be filled on or before 30<sup>th</sup> November.
4. Late - Fee forms have to be filled on or before 20<sup>th</sup> December with a fine of 100 and 500 after 31<sup>st</sup> December.
